6. Central Arizona Project Association (CAPA) -- material pertaining to CAPA. Most of the information is in the form of situation reports, a non-public report stating the progress of the CAPA and current legislation.

7. Central Arizona Project Association - Communications Concerning -- correspondence mainly in the form of resolutions in support of, to H.S. Raymond, president of CAPA. (See also **Central Arizona Project Association**)

8. Colorado River Association -- material, mostly newsletters, dealing with the accomplishments of the organization.

9. "Economics of Arizona Water Problems" -- by Robert A. Young and William E. Martin and comments by noted authorities.

10. Goss Plan -- Floyd L. Goss, chief electrical engineer and assistant manager of the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power, plan to increase the power of the proposed Hualapai Dam by construction of a pump-storage unit. The file has comments and other material on the plan.

11. Hualapai Dam (See also **Bridge Canyon Dam**) -- material pertains directly to the Bridge Canyon Dam, renamed the Hualapai Dam.
