HISTORICAL NOTE: John Doherty was the principle organizer and creator of this collection which reflects an interest in organized crime involving high profile individuals in Arizona. He collected memos, newspaper articles, and book chapters on topics including people, places, businesses and crime for use in the newsroom by investigative reporters and staff. Doherty used the files to prod reporters and editors with new leads and story ideas. The investigative team of the paper was disbanded in the mid-1990s. Doherty, concerned about what would happen to nearly two decades of work, preserved the files in his home and added to the material over the years.

As an investigative reporter for the *Arizona Republic*, Don Bolles made use of this collection as well as contributed to it. Bolles, who was known for investigating organized crime links, was killed in June of 1976 when he responded to an anonymous tip about land fraud. The source did not show up for the meeting. Bolles went back to his car, started it, and was mortally wounded by a remotely detonated bomb that had been placed under his car. Eleven days later, Bolles died from his injuries. Three men, John Adamson, Max Dunlap, and James Robison were all arrested and tried for the murder. Adamson pleaded guilty and served 25 years, Dunlap is serving a life sentence, and Robison was acquitted in a later retrial. Some feel that a larger power, namely Kemper Marley, was behind the entire event. However, this has never been proved.

Established in 1975, the Investigative Reporters and Editors, Inc. (IRE) was a "grassroots non-profit organization dedicated to improving the quality of investigative reporting." After the murder of Bolles, who was a founding member of the IRE, the group descended

upon Phoenix to investigate organized crime within the state. A series of articles, published in 1977 known as the *Arizona Project*, highlighted their findings. While several major newspapers ran the series, the *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post* chose not to participate. Even the *Arizona Republic*, Bolles' home newspaper, did not print the full series.

There was one box of books within the collection. Those books were removed and catalogued with the Arizona Historical Foundation book holdings.

The majority of the collection is comprised of newspaper articles. Many are photocopies and facsimiles of the originals. However, there are also a fair amount of original newsprint articles which have become brittle, yellow, and highly acidic with age. All original newsprint was sleeved between acid free paper in order to not damage any of the other documents.

It should be noted that all was done to maintain the original order of the collection when possible. For most folders, headings were taken directly from the original folder title except in cases where there was none or materials were loose or in unmarked folders. Generally, contents of each folder are arranged first with memos in date order, followed by undated memos, newspaper articles chronological by year, and finally with undated articles. Photographs and other media have been placed at the back of the folder.

Another important feature of this collection is that materials are very well cited. Most articles and other photocopied items have the name of the newspaper or source written, stamped, or typed on them along with the date it was published. If no source is cited, generally a date is almost always included. However, the researcher will find materials with no citations or dates within the collection.

Every effort was made to weed duplicate copies from the folders. One copy was kept of each item in a given folder. However, given the nature of the collection, some topics naturally overlap. You may find articles on a particular person in the People Series, and then find similar or duplicate articles on the same topic in another series. Only multiple copies within each folder of each series were discarded. Articles appearing in multiple series were not discarded because they were intended to be filed that way. Therefore, it is possible the researcher may encounter duplicate materials throughout the collection.

Some folders contained photographs or other media materials. A special note has been added to that folder to alert the researcher to its contents. Given the small amount of photographs and other formats, it was not necessary to create an entire series reflecting them. Instead materials are housed in protective acid-free envelopes and generally appear at the end of a folder.

The collection is arranged into seven series: Series I: Don Bolles; Series II: People; Series III: Places; Series IV: Businesses; Series V: Crime; Series VI: IRE; Series VII: Crime Commissions; Series VIII: General

Series I: Don Bolles Don Bolles, a central figure to this collection, was an investigative reporter killed in a car bombing in 1976. Included in this series are articles relating to Bolles regarding his murder and the trial that followed. Also listed are bylines and memos written by Bolles, his personal notebooks, and other research. One of the most important parts of this series is the comprehensive collection of bylines written by Bolles. Of other significant research value are Bolles' appointment books and research notes. Bolles also compiled an index of organized crime figures that was highly used in the department. Folders are arranged alphabetically within each series, then chronologically within each folder unless otherwise noted.
