SCOPE AND CONTENT

Consuelo Boyd, multi-lingual librarian, writer and researcher, often worked as a translator. This collection is comprised of manuscript materials and correspondence. Among the manuscripts is a copy of Boyd's English Translation of the Index to El Archivo de Hidalgo del Parral, 1631-1821, which was published in 1971 (At ASU: on microfilm and cataloged as CD 3676.P313 1631) Also included is a manuscript copy of Rudolph Francis Acuna's doctoral dissertation, on which the book Sonora Strongman was based. Several photographs of Spanish missions and Mexican villages have been removed and cataloged separately.
