BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

A teacher by profession, Kenneth Dale went on to earn advanced degrees in educational administration at the University of North Dakota. His Masters Thesis, entitled "The Educational Program in North Dakota Companies of the Civilian Conservation Corps" was completed in 1936. Continuing in the same program, Dale received his PhD. in education in 1949. His dissertation topic was "Navajo Indian Educational Administration." This interest in Indian education led Dale to Arizona in 1950, where he remained as an academic professional.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Kenneth Dale Collection consists of two series: manuscripts and printed matter. The printed matter consists of reports and pamphlets relating to Indian education and welfare, which Dale collected as part of his dissertation research. The manuscript items include Dale's work and other writings pertaining to education and/or Indians. Six books and one map have been removed from the collection and cataloged separately (list follows). This collection was a gift of Kenneth Dale in 1975.
