

MADISON R. LORING COLLECTION-MSS 84

George E. Loring (1854-1932) came to Phoenix as a young man with members of the Boston Colonist Party in 1876. He opened a general merchandising business, eventually becoming the Loring Bazaar, operating the Wells Fargo Agency from his Phoenix store. This collection consists of original family letters and xeroxed copies of the family letters from the Huntington Library of San Marino. These tell the story of Loring's ordeal and hardships encountered not only during his move out to Arizona but also in Arizona. Also included are newspaper clippings; pioneer biography files and correspondence of Madison R. Loring with individuals and organizations concerning his father's papers.
