Biographical Sketch

Lester "Budge" Ruffner (1918-), a lifetime resident of Prescott, Arizona, is the son of Arizona pioneers. Ruffner was a mortician, and operated the Ruffner Funeral Home in Prescott. He became active in civic affairs, and was named Prescott's "Man of the Year" in 1964. During the late 1960's Ruffner began his second career as a journalist, and wrote a column which appeared in the <u>Prescott Paper</u> and <u>Prescott Courier</u>. In 1971, Ruffner published a collection of these newspaper columns about the history of Arizona and the Southwest entitled <u>All Hell Needs is Water</u>.

Scope and Content

The Ruffner Collection consists of one series: Newspaper Columns (which includes some related correspondence).
