

## ROSCOE WILLSON COLLECTION-MSS 46

Records: 48 boxes, 21 binders, 20 cu. ft., 1879-1976

### Biographical Information

Roscoe G. Willson was born in Yellow Medicine County, Minnesota, the son of a country newspaper editor. He finished high school at 16 and worked on his father's newspaper, which he later published for a year.

After three years of wandering over Mexico, working on railroad construction and on coffee and rubber plantations, Wilson came to Arizona in 1902 and worked at Crown King. He did some prospecting before joining the newly organized US. Forest Service in 1905. He put in 14 years with the forest service, resigning in 1919 to run sheep and work in oil fields.

In 1924, Willson and his wife Maude opened the Arizona Specialty Company. He sold the business in 1945 to retire. He then he began writing for the Sunday edition of the Arizona Republic in 1947 and continued doing so until his death August 25, 1976 at the age of 97.

### Scope and Content

The Roscoe Willson Collection consists of 27 boxes and 21 binders of correspondence, clippings and manuscript material on Arizona and Western history, most of which was used in Willson's "Arizona Days and Ways" newspaper column.

There is also biographical information on Willson, some business records, personal correspondence and diaries.
